



Amnesty International is a global non-governmental organization of more than 7 million people in over 150 countries and territories who campaign to end abuses of human rights. The organization was founded in London in 1961 following the article publication “The Forgotten Prisoners” by the lawyer Peter Benenson. The organization is monitoring and investigating human rights violations as well as lobbying governments and companies to make sure that they keep their promises and respect international law. Moreover Amnesty International is constantly mobilizing supporters around the world to campaign for change and stand in defence of activist on the frontline. Simultaneously the organization is involved in providing education and training sessions related to human rights issues. Amnesty International was awarded with the Nobel Peace Prize in 1977 for its campaign against torture and the United Nations Prize in the Field of Human Rights in 1978.
